Why We Investigate

A Court of Inquiry is held to establish exactly what happened so as to **avoid a recurrence**, or to **minimise the effects** if it does recur.



Why We Investigate

As a secondary function, the record of proceedings also serve to determine the extent of any loss or damage to public property, and as a permanent record of the event.

Responsibility for Assembly

Air Officer Commanding Chief of Air Staff



When We Investigate

All events where there has been loss of life or serious injury or the damage is assessed as category five (destroyed), whether or not the cause of the accident is free from doubt.

When We Investigate All events where the damage is assessed as category three or four, unless the cause is free from doubt or the holding of a Court of Inquiry would serve no useful purpose.

When We Investigate

Any other flight safety event where the Assembling Authority considers that an investigation of the incident by a Court of Inquiry is justified.

Terms of Reference

Legal Basis of the Court of Inquiry



Terms of Reference

Investigate the circumstances. Determine all of the causal factors. Ascertain any injuries to personnel, service or civilian. Ascertain if service personnel involved were on duty.

Terms of Reference

Ascertain if all orders and instructions were complied with and were relevant. Ascertain if aircraft escape facilities were fully utilised. Make recommendations if necessary.

The Report

Evidence... What people say **Findings...** The Court's report Exhibits... **Documents** and physical items which support the findings

Evidence

Hearsay? Opinion? Relevance! Best! Privileged



Can be Compelled Must be Sworn and Cautioned Can be Cross Examined Need not Incriminate Themselves



RP 144: Protection of Members If a person's conduct is being investigated: President must be senior in rank Members must be senior in seniority



RP 154: Protection of Witnesses If a witness' Character or Service **Reputation** is likely to be affected they have the option to: **Read or hear evidence Question witnesses Receive a copy of the report**

RP 158: Protection of Witnesses

Proceedings cannot be used against anyone at any other legal proceedings (Exception: Perjury)



RP 159: Protection of Inquiry

Release of Record of Proceedings to any person not subject to the AFDA requires the authority of a Superior Commander



AFDA s200: Disciplinary Action

If disciplinary action likely President informs Assembling Authority **Separate Summary of Evidence** New independent investigation

Disciplinary Action

Must separate all disciplinary action completely from safety investigation Importance of the Court of Inquiry being seen as separate



Legal review and comment Accepted by CAS Recommendations Binding
