About ANZSASI 2026

The ANZSASI Conference initiative has been evolving rapidly over recent years to become a highly valuable resource to aviation safety professionals, as well as its traditional base of air safety investigators.

A joint initiative of the 'New Zealand Society of Air Safety Investigators' and the 'Australian Society of Air Safety Investigators', the aim of the conference is to provide ongoing professional development for aviation industry professionals working in the field of aviation safety and accident investigation.

The origins of the ANZSASI Conference dates to the inaugural 'Regional Seminar' event run in Brisbane in 1997, and in the current era, the conference is hosted on an annual rotation basis between the Australian and New Zealand societies.

The Asia Pacific Cabin Safety Working Group (APCSWG) Seminar is also held alongside the ANZSASI Conference each year.

Who Should Attend

The ANZSASI conference is aimed at experienced and early career air accident investigation professionals, as well as aviation safety professionals, and academics. University-level students interested in air accident investigation are also encouraged to attend.

Program

The conference program is focused on keeping aviation safety professionals and air safety investigators up to date on developments in the sector and on the results and insights from important incident and accident investigations from a regional and global perspective. Sessions will include keynote presentations and panel discussions from the leaders of defence and civil investigation agencies, as well as safety specialists from airlines, manufacturers, regulators and ANSPs. The draft program will be published in mid-April.

The Australian Society of Air Safety Investigators (ASASI) was formed in 1978 after an inaugural meeting held in Melbourne, Victoria. ASASI was formed to better serve and represent the views of air safety investigators in Australia. Since then, ASASI has grown to a membership of 150 plus and now hosts a biennial conference in conjunction with the New Zealand Society of Air Safety Investigators (NZSASI).

ASASI is affiliated with International Society of Air Safety Investigators (ISASI).



An International Network

The International Society of Air Safety Investigators (ISASI) is the umbrella society for both ASASI and NZSASI. ISASI was formed to promote air safety by the exchange of ideas, experiences and information about aircraft accident investigations, and to aid in the advancement of flight safety. The Society assists in providing professional networking opportunities among its members.

The original Society was founded in the United States in 1964 as the Society of Air Safety Investigators. With the establishment of the Canadian and Australian Societies and with members from 35 countries, the international nature of the Society was recognized in 1977, and the name was changed to the International Society of Air Safety Investigators.

Affiliated Societies are located in Asia, Australia, Canada, Europe, Latin America, Middle East and North Africa, New Zealand, Pakistan, United States and West Africa.
